Warning to the unbeliever

Let me give you a warning and it is going to be different than the warnings you have heard before. Jesus spoke to some Jews in the Temple, saying, "You are of your Father, the devil, and you want to do the desires of your father. He was a murderer from the beginning, and doesn't stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaks a lie, he speaks on his own; for he is a liar, and the father of it." (John 8:44). When God becomes your Father, you are now subject to being disciplined by God (For whom the Lord loves, he chastens, And scourges every son whom he receives. It is for discipline that you endure. God deals with you as with children, for what son is there whom his father doesn't discipline?—Prov. 3:12 Heb. 12:6–7). You still have your free will; you can still do whatever it is you want to do. You can have a field day doing every evil thing that you can think of; and you cannot lose your salvation. However, that is a double-edged sword. You cannot lose your salvation; and you cannot lose God. Every time you sin, you are going to potentially face discipline. Your life on earth could become the most miserable existence a person could ever have. I know that you have heard some evangelists say, "Believe in Jesus and you will have a fulfilled and happy life." Well, that isn't exactly true. If you get with the program—if you regularly name your sins to God and you learn God's plan under a pastorteacher, then you can have a remarkable life—however, if you get religious, if you join a cult, if you imitate believers that you meet and like, if you go back to sinning without a thought to the choice you made, things are going to be different. God did not discipline you for sin before because God was not your Father; God will discipline you now, because He has become your Father. Once that relationship has been established (and it can be established in a few seconds; the time it takes to believe in Jesus Christ), there are no takebacks; there is no way to undo this. You cannot even renounce Christ in hopes of getting out of this (If we endure [grow spiritually; function in this life as God has intended], we will also reign with him [this is a part of our eternal rewards package; you might call it our life-severance package]; if we deny him, he also will deny us [rewards]; if we are faithless, He remains faithful-for He cannot deny Himself-2Tim. 2:12-13). Our salvation is based upon what Jesus Christ did for us on the cross; we appropriate it by believing in Him; God keeps us after that point; He does not let us go. Since our salvation is based upon Christ and His work, even if we are faithless after salvation, He remains faithful to us, because He cannot deny Himself.
