This Week's Events


Chick-fil-A:

A week or so ago, the owner of the private company, Chick-fil-A, spoke affirmatively of normal marriage, and said that trying to change the definition of marriage in America was defying God's Word. Four mayors came out against Chick-fil-A, and talked about not letting them come into their arena of influence, as if these mayors were kings of their little realm (at least two of them backed off partially).

Mike Huckabee, a former Republican presidential hopeful and now a FoxNews host, suggested that



people who believed in free speech and/or a normal marriage show Chick-fil-A their support by buying some food there on August 1st; and this ended up being the largest sales day for Chick-fil-A ever, with lines of cars extending for blocks and even miles in some places. In several areas, Chick-fil-A brought out lemon aid and <u>water</u> to protestors. People also went to Chick-fil-A in large numbers on Thursday, and Friday was declared some sort of a gay <u>kiss-in</u>, where gays were to go to Chick-fil-A's and kiss.



One picture floating around the internet has people lined up at Chick-fil-A berating Christians for showing up to their, but not to homeless shelters or food kitchens to help. That



conservatives give more of their time and money than liberals has been <u>verified</u> on many occasions.

The War on Religion:


Priests for Life, a Catholic organization that has been on the front lines of the pro-life cause for the past 20 years, announced August 1 that it will not comply with the Health and Human Services (HHS) contraception mandate which went into effect on that date. The mandate, which is already the target of over a score of lawsuits filed by nearly 60 faith-based organizations, requires that all non-church employers provide their employees with health insurance that includes free access to sterilization and contraception including abortion-inducing drugs.

The 2012 election:

This week, the Obama for America Campaign, the Democratic National Committee and the Ohio Democratic Party <u>filed suit</u> in OH to strike down part of that state's law governing voting by members of the military (it gave the military <u>a couple extra days to vote</u>). Their suit said that part of the law is "arbitrary" with "no discernible rational basis."

Actress Roseanne Barr <u>announced</u> Thursday that she is seeking the Peace and Freedom Party's nomination for president, with anti-war activist Cindy Sheehan as her intended running mate. Barr had earlier sought the Green Party's nomination, but lost to Massachusetts physician Jill Stein.

Actor Clint Eastwood came out in <u>support</u> of Mitt Romney.



The economy:

An Indiana-based medical equipment manufacturer, Cook Medical, says it is scrapping plans to open five new plants in the coming years because of a looming tax tied to President Obama's health care overhaul law. They claim that the tax on medical devices, set to take effect next year, will cost the company roughly \$20 million a year, cutting into money that would otherwise go toward expanding into new facilities over the next five years.

<u>Carbonite</u> famously dropped Rush Limbaugh on a Saturday Night at the height of the Sandra Fluke controversy. Carbonite became the poster child for the Rush boycott movement organized by

Media Matters, which coordinated the effort with so-called independent groups. On August 1 Carbonite released its 2d Quarter 2012 results, the first full quarter after dropping Limbaugh in March. The results shocked Wall Street, as Carbonite did not meet its growth targets, causing multiple analysts to drop the target price. The stock dropped 15% in a day.

President Barack Obama's regulatory czar Cass Sunstein <u>is</u> <u>resigning</u> his position in the Obama administration.

Despite being saved by the government and still propped up by tens of billions of dollars, GM profits dropped 41% in the 2nd quarter.




Our government at work:

A report by the Government Accountability Office has <u>revealed</u> that taxpayer-funded Amtrak has lost more than \$800 million in food and beverage sales over the last ten years, largely due to waste, theft, and a lack of proper oversight.

A top White House adviser received clear notice that solar panel maker Solyndra Inc. faced a "severe liquidity crisis" even before a

controversial restructuring allowing investors to recoup money from the now-bankrupt company before taxpayers.



Obamacare:

Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid has again blocked a Republican attempt to vote on repealing the healthcare reform law this week.

Local matters:

Washington voters last year approved privatization of the state's liquor business, opening up liquor sales to grocery stores and other retailers. However, government then requried a new 10% distributor fee and a 17% retail fee to replace money the state lost when it shut down its state-run liquor stores. The result was higher prices for consumers at many retail outlets. Not too much of a surprise: liquor sales increased dramatically in Idaho and Oregon in their border stores. What I did not know is, Idaho and Oregon both have state-run liquor stores.



From the <u>LA Times</u>: "Gov. Jerry Brown's administration on Friday announced that \$119 million more in untapped money was found in a sweeping audit of state accounts, bringing to more than \$286.5 million the sum lawmakers were unaware of as they repeatedly cut government services. The additional money that lawmakers were unaware of includes funds for healthcare programs, reimbursement of crime victims and cleanup of underground petroleum tanks."



Mark Clayton, 35, reported raising no money and campaigned little, but received more than 48,000 votes- twice the number of his nearest competitor in Thursday's seven-candidate Democratic primary. However, because of his clear stand against gay marriage, the Tennessee Democratic Party is disavowing the man who won the party's nomination to challenge Republican Sen. Bob Corker in November. Clayton campaign's Facebook page champions three major positions: strict adherence to the U.S. Constitution, family stances that are pro-life, and keeping the country from turning into "an Orwellian super state."

I am a couple months late in mentioning this, but, while some cities have called themselves

sanctuary cities; Costa Mesa, CA declared itself a <u>rule of law</u> city. That means, the city council intends to abide by the law there.

The Gay Agenda:

The Civil Rights Agenda, a local LGBT rights advocacy group, <u>filed multiple complaints</u> with the Illinois Department of Human Rights Thursday, alleging that the Atlanta-based Chick-fil-A restaurant chain's "intolerant corporate culture" violates Illinois law and a provision in the state's Human Rights Act.



The liberal agenda:

OnStar and General Motors have become official partners of Pecan Street Inc., the country's first nonprofit research and development consortia, where residents agreed to be part of a clean-energy smart grid test for sustainable living. This is a 700-acre planned community near Austin, TX, will test the impact of "smart homes" and other green technology, like electronic vehicles. 100 Chevy volts were offered at deeply discounted prices, and 55 of them were purchased. They have rejected my suggested name, A Very Deep Hole.


same man who has, for the past month, been claiming that he was told over the phone that Mitt Romney paid no taxes for 10 years.




Liberals:

After recording the conversation, my enthusiasm in standing up against Chick-fil-A was very high, and in that moment, I decided to post the video. For me, and at that moment, the main goal of supporting the gay community outweighed the collateral damage that Rachel became. And I literally just saw Rachel as collateral damage. We have to stop rationalizing our destructive actions this way. We have to start seeing people as people. We aren't ever going to make social progress by personally attacking people. I'm clearly guilty of this. The degree of reaction my video ended up having took me by surprise, obviously. There was a lot of passion expressed, and still is being expressed. Part of me is quite discouraged by the threats made to my family and former co-workers. But another part of me is encouraged. If people can get this passionate about a guy being rude to a girl in a drive-through, how much more passion can we have for our fellow human beings whose basic rights are being threatened by corporations like Chick-fil-A. How much more passion can we channel toward fighting for equal rights - for all people, not just straight ones."



Liberals on Mitt Romney's tax returns:

Senate leader Harry Reid, back in July: "His father, George Romney, set the precedent, that people running for president file their tax returns, let everybody look at them. But Mitt Romney can't do that because he's basically paid no taxes in the prior 12 years."



Harry Reid, to the Huffington Post, at the end of July, about a man who invested in Bain Capital who called Reid up a month ago: "Harry, he didn't pay any taxes for 10 years. Former car czar Steve Rattner on CNN: "I will tell you that as a private equity guy, I'm familiar with many of the things that he did. And I know many people who have done many of the things that he did. I do not know anyone who did everything

that he did. Some of what he did, like the [up to \$100 million] IRA, I have asked fellow private equity guys . . . none of us had even known this was a possible trick, if you will. He has pushed the envelope all the way to the edge, to his benefit, and I think that Americans would find that pretty distasteful."

CBS's Bill Buck: "Whatever the level of exaggeration from the Senator or his source, there is probably at least some level of truth to the statement. Unfortunately, Romney is stonewalling the American public by not releasing his records so we'll never know the truth."

Harry Reid, from the Senate floor: "The word's out that he hasn't paid any taxes for 10 years. Let him prove he has paid taxes, because he hasn't." The word is out because Reid put the word out.


The gay agenda:


The campaign:


Romney: "I've paid taxes every year—and a lot of taxes."

However, 195,000 fewer Americans had jobs this month as opposed to last month, as 150,000 Americans dropped out of the labor force (and so were not counted in the Labor Department's calculation of the unemployment rate).

The labor force participation rate is the percentage of working-age persons who are employed and who are unemployed but looking for a job. Typically "working-age persons" is defined as people between the ages of 16-64. People in those age groups who are not counted as participating in the labor force are typically students, homemakers, and persons under the age of 64 who are retired. Right now, the labor participation rate is 63.8%; although I heard that


Employment to Population Ratio Broader measurement than Labor Participation Rate, includes all working-age persons 16-64. Measures what percentage of people between the ages of 18 and 64 that have a job. The employment ratio is 58.6%.

175,000 fewer American women held jobs in July than in June. From June to July, the number of women in the labor force-meaning they either had a job or had actively looked for one in the last four weeks-dropped by 94,000.

The number of young adults ages 20 to 34 who lived with their parents jumped from 17% in 1980 to 24% in 2007-09 - the Great Recession-according to a detailed analysis out today. The rise was sharpest among those under 25 - a new high of 43% vs. 32% in 1980 - but it increased largely across the board. Even among 30-to-34-year-olds, nearly one in 10 lived with parents.

President Obama's budget—his plan to pay down the debt and which was unanimously voted down in the House and the Senate—would increase the national debt to \$25.4 trillion by 2022, according to the office of Sen. 
How Times Have Changed

Having been born in 1936 has allowed me to witness both societal progress and retrogression. High on the list of things made better in our society are the great gains in civil liberties and economic opportunities, especially for racial minorities and women. People who are now deemed poor have a level of material wealth that would have been a pipe dream to yesteryear's poor. But despite the fact that today's Americans have achieved an unprecedented level of

prosperity, we have become spiritually and morally impoverished compared with our ancestors.

Years ago, spending beyond one's means was considered a character defect. Today not only do people spend beyond their means but also there are companies that advertise on radio and TV to eliminate or reduce your credit card and mortgage debt. Students saddled with college loans have called for student loan forgiveness. Yesterday's Americans would have viewed it as morally corrupt and reprehensible to accumulate debt and then seek to avoid paying it. It's nothing less than theft. What's worse is there's little condemnation of it by the rest of us.



Earlier this year, as a result of a budget crunch, the Philadelphia School District had to lay off 91 school police officers. During the 1940s and '50s, I attended Philadelphia schools in poor neighborhoods. The only time we saw a policeman in school was during an assembly period when we had to listen to a boring lecture about safety. Because teacher assaults are tolerated -- 4,000 over the past five years in Philadelphia -- school police are needed. Prior to the '60s, few students would have thought of

talking back to a teacher, and no one would have cursed, much less assaulted, a teacher.

I couldn't have been more than 8, 9 or 10 years old when one time, on the way home from school, my cousin and I were having a stone fight with some other youngsters. An elderly black lady walked up to my cousin and me and asked, "Does your mother know you're out here throwing stones?" We replied, "No, ma'am," praying that the matter rested there. Today an adult doing the same thing risks being cursed and possibly assaulted. Fearing retaliation, adults sit in silence as young people use vile language to one another on public conveyances, in school corridors and on the streets.

Yesteryear there was little tolerance for the kinds of crude behavior and language that are accepted today. To see a man sitting on a bus or trolley car while a woman is standing used to be unthinkable. Children didn't address adults by their first name. By the way, over the course of my nearly 45 years of teaching, on several occasions, students have addressed me by my first name. I have told them that I don't mind their addressing me by my first name but that my first name is Professor.

Much of what's accepted today would have been seen as bizarre and lowdown yesteryear. Out-of-wedlock childbirth was a disgrace and surely wouldn't have occasioned a baby shower. Popular TV shows such as "The Jerry Springer Show" and "Maury" feature guests who openly discuss despicable acts in their personal lives, often to the applause of the audience. Shame is going the way of the dinosaur.

You say, "Williams, you're just old-fashioned and out of touch with modern society." Maybe so, but I think that a society's first line of defense is not the law but customs, traditions and moral values. These behavioral norms -- transmitted by example, word of mouth, religious teachings, rules of etiquette and manners -- represent a

body of wisdom distilled over the ages through experience and trial and error. They include important legal thou-shalt-nots -- such as shalt not murder, steal, lie or cheat -- but they also include all those civilities one might call ladylike or gentlemanly behavior. Police officers and courts can never replace these social restraints on personal conduct. At best, laws, police and the criminal justice system are a society's last desperate line of defense.

Britain's NHS: No Fun and Games

Most Brits who can afford private health insurance buy that instead.

The International Olympic Committee decided not to include in the opening ceremony a moment of silence to honor the eleven Israeli athletes killed by Palestinian gunmen during the 1972 games in Munich. That move drew the ire of NBC's Bob Costas. During Friday's ceremony, he commented that, although a private moment of silence was held before a mere 100 people this week at the Athlete's Village, "for many, tonight, with the world watching, is the true time and place to remember those who were lost and how and why they died."

Instead, the Olympic ceremony featured a weird, politically correct extravaganza by film director Danny Boyle (Slumdog Millionaire). It was hailed by the sports website The Roar with the headline "London 2012: Most political Olympics opening ceremony since Berlin 1936." The 1936 games, of course, were an infamous propaganda exercise for Adolf Hitler.

For The Roar's Spiro Zanos, "the political message at London was that Britain could recover its greatness and become Great Britain once again if . . . [it] re-embraced the radical politics that unleashed the industrial revolution and the welfare state. . . . If this means having the most political opening ceremony since the Berlin Olympics in 1936, then so be it." The state-worship so ably skewered by Jonah Goldberg in Liberal Fascism is alive and well.

The Boyle ceremony got underway with images of a bucolic Britain being swept away by a cigar-chomping elite that builds satanic mills filled with oppressed workers as steeplejacks hang from the towering chimneys. Later, 600 doctors and patients recruited from National Health Service hospitals were featured in a bizarre tribute to socialized medicine, with children bouncing up and down on 320 hospital beds arrayed in front of a giant Franken-baby wrapped in bandages. Villains from British children's literature, ranging from Cruella de Vil to Lord Voldemort, sweep in on the children, in an apparent reference to conservative forces seeking to reform the tottering NHS. The 15-minute sequence ended with a series of red lights triumphantly spelling out "NHS."

Left-wingers were thrilled. "Brilliant that we got a socialist to do the opening ceremony," tweeted Alastair Campbell, former communications chief for the Labour party. Boyle denied he was promoting a political agenda. "The sensibility of the show is very personal," he told reporters. "We had no agenda other than... values that we feel are true." At a news conference beforehand, he explained that one of the reasons he "put the NHS in the show is that everyone is aware of how important NHS is to everybody in the country. One of the core values of our society is that it doesn't matter who you are, you will get treated the same in terms of health care."

Can anyone seriously believe that? Sunday's British papers report that a study by the research firm Lloyd's TSB Premier Banking found that nearly two-thirds of Britons earning more than \$78,700 a year have taken out private health

insurance because they don't trust the NHS. A survey by the British health-care organization Bupa found that two-thirds of its customers cited the risk of infection from superbugs as a top reason for buying private insurance. Shaun Matisonn, the chief executive of PruHealth, says that "patients today are sophisticated consumers of health care. They research the treatments they want, but cannot always get them through the NHS."

Horror stories about the NHS abound. A 2007 survey of almost 1,000 physicians by Doctors' Magazine found that two-thirds said they had been told by their local NHS trust not to prescribe certain drugs, and one in five doctors knew patients who had suffered as a result of treatment rationing. The study cited one physician who characterized the NHS as "a lottery." A new study this year by GP magazine supports that conclusion. Through Freedom of Information Act records, it found that 90 percent of NHS trusts were rationing care.

Rick Dewsbury of the Daily Mail was aghast at the worship of the NHS during Friday's Olympic ceremony. The columnist noted the sheer hypocrisy of the spectacle, as "the majority of the athletes taking part in the Games will have access to the most expensive cutting-edge private treatment available in the world for even the slightest graze on their bodies."

Dewsbury recounted the 2009 case of Kane Gorny, a 22-year-old NHS patient. Gorny was admitted to the hospital for a hip replacement. A series of hospital employees refused his request for a glass of water and failed to give him diabetes medication. He went so far as to call the emergency operator for help. When the police arrived, nurses assured them that Gorny was confused and needed no outside help. A day later, he was dead of dehydration. The official inquest into his death was published this month. It found that neglect by hospital staff - "a cascade of individual failures" - contributed to his death.

Here's hoping that not everyone is "treated the same" in Britain's NHS hospitals.

In Britain, we have seen what could be our future, and it's not a pretty sight.

Government bungled Solyndra decisions: Republican report

(Reuters) - The Obama administration ignored internal warnings to cut its losses on Solyndra and instead opted for a restructuring that led to a bigger loss for taxpayers when the solar panel maker went bankrupt, Republican investigators said on Thursday.

In its final report on its 18-month probe into the failed \$535 million loan, the Republican-led House Energy and Commerce Committee said the Energy Department rushed into the deal, then helped keep the company going despite a series of red flags.

"Solyndra should stand as a cautionary tale of what happens when an administration ties itself to a project so closely that it becomes the poster child of its signature economic policy," the 147-page report concluded.

Investigators -- lawyers and staff members on the Republican-controlled committee -- reviewed more than 300,000 pages of documents, including many internal emails that have embarrassed President Barack Obama, who held the company up as an example of how the government could help spur renewable energy jobs.

The failure has become a political weapon for Republicans ahead of the November 6 elections

as they seek to highlight their own energy policies, which are more favorable to the fossil fuels industry than to alternatives.

A White House spokesman dismissed the report, saying the documents, briefings, and hearings confirm the Energy Department's decision was "merit-based" and slammed the Republicans for wasting time and money on the probe.

In a memo, Democratic staff on the committee said the report "contains obvious inaccuracies, frequent misstatements, cherry-picked evidence, and glaring omissions of exculpatory information."

They accused Republicans of oversimplifying the remarkable plunge in prices for solar panels because of Chinese competition that they said caused Solyndra's demise.

The FBI has been investigating the failed company for close to a year in tandem with the Energy Department's Inspector General, an independent watchdog.

CONCERNS RAISED EARLY AND OFTEN

In early 2009, Energy Secretary Steven Chu had made it a top priority to get the loans program, funded through economic stimulus initiatives, running quickly, and Solyndra was the first company to get a guarantee.

Solyndra had developed a new kind of solar panel and sought a loan guarantee to build a second factory.

Emails showed Energy Department financial analyst Kelly Colyar raised questions about the proposed loan early in 2009, but officials above her rushed the loan through the initial approval process by March because of a planned publicity event.

Democratic staff on the committee said the emails showed healthy internal debate, and said Colyar confirmed in an interview "that no corners were cut in the review of Solyndra's application."

Treasury Department officials also raised alarms on the deal. "Treasury had NOT had time to review and consult with Energy on the term sheet, which is a statutory requirement," said Paula Farrell, a policy director at Treasury.

After a one-day review, Gary Burner, the chief financial officer of Treasury's Federal Financing Bank concluded: "I do not like this deal, but it is not the worst I've seen."

Analysts at the White House Office of Management and Budget also wanted an announcement on the finalized loan guarantee to be postponed.

"Recent developments in the solar market, in particular, pricing pressure from China from silicon wafer plants scheduled to come on line ... raise concerns about how strong Solyndra's position will be in the face of rising competition," wrote Kevin Carroll, chief of OMB's energy branch.

The OMB review of the Solyndra deal was completed in nine days, but the average time for review for subsequent loans was 28 days, the report said.

MORE RED FLAGS

By March 2010, an auditor had warned the company would have trouble remaining a "going concern" in a Securities and Exchange Commission filing.

The company hired two Washington lobby firms to pursue government contracts to get their panels used at military bases. But the company was running out of money. A report by independent consultant Navigant in September said Solyndra's costs were too high to compete.

Layoffs at the company were delayed until just after the November 2010 election, a decision now being investigated by the Justice Department, the report said.

The Energy Department and the company's private sector backers worked to restructure the loan. That deal put the government behind private investors in the eventual bankruptcy.

Financial analyst Colyar, who by then had moved to work at the OMB, flagged early in 2011 that the government would recover more if it allowed Solyndra to go bankrupt instead of restructuring.

ROLE OF OBAMA CONTRIBUTOR

During the investigation, Republicans accused the administration of making decisions to favor one of the company's private backers, George Kaiser, a billionaire from Oklahoma, who had contributed to Obama's campaign.

But Democrats said the findings did not support that. "The report is remarkably silent on the influence of campaign contributions," Democrats on the energy committee said in a memo, noting that all officials interviewed said contributions played no role in their decisions.

Argonaut Private Equity, the investment arm for Kaiser's foundation, eventually owned a 39 percent stake in the company, investing about \$430 million.

Emails from Kaiser and his financial advisers showed that he was aware of what was happening with the company and the loan but the probe did not establish that he influenced government decisions.

When the top Energy Department loan official, Jonathan Silver, tried to phone Kaiser directly in

August 2011, emails showed Kaiser would not take his call, and complained to his advisers that Silver had not used the "correct" channels.

But the Palin-haters who dismissed her as being on the show only because of her famous mother proved their real agenda when Chastity "Chaz" Bono took a turn (as a "male") on the program, and the crickets chirped.

In addition to the TLC series "Sarah Palin's Alaska" and Bristol's two turns on "Dancing," Bristol is currently on the show "Life's a Tripp" on Lifetime.

Her father Todd will star in the fall on the NBC show "Stars Earn Stripes." There's no doubt the TV critics hate the idea of this family on television.

Washington Post critic Lisa de Moraes made great fun of how the Palins are cashing in to become "the Barrymores of reality TV" and competing with the Kardashians to see which shameless "family business" can do the most programs. The Palins have a good response: "I don't think it's our business," Bristol said of her family, when one TV critic asked that question. "I just think you guys are going to be talking about us either way, so we might as well be doing something enjoyable and fun."

"You haven't gone full Kardashian," joked ABC host Tom Bergeron. "No, not at all," Bristol replied. Bristol kept up the "might as well have fun" line for the next hardball. She was asked: If you don't like the harsh media attention, then why don't you just go home to Alaska and raise your son, rather than make yourself a target? The "please go home" feeling in the question was unmistakeable.

In the eyes of these critics, the Kennedys are American royalty, while the Palins are to cordoned off with reality TV divas like the Kardashians, or hicks like the stars of "Hillbilly Handfishing."

A journalist also brought up a recent episode of "Life's a Tripp" where Bristol's son said an "F-word" that was bleeped. (I say "a journalist" because the critics don't identify each other by name when they report on how they have picked on young Palins.) Gay activists claimed the little boy uttered their hated F-word, and Lifetime's corporate line of defense was no, actually it was the more common F-bomb. The better question is why Lifetime felt that tantrum of profanity and brattiness was considered great television, instead of cutting-room floor garbage. The toddler bleeps haven't helped. The "Tripp" show

has performed badly enough that it's now airing in a late-night slot.

The critics' toughest hardball question for Bristol was how she would react if paired with a homosexual professional partner on the new season of "Dancing With the Stars." It's also a somewhat strange question. On Bristol's previous tour of the show, bisexual comedian Margaret Cho and her gay professional partner, Louis van Amstel, danced to "Copacabana" with a gay-pride message. There was no storming off the set or critical comments from Team Palin. But that is never good enough.

Under fire from the journalists, Bristol answered: "You know what? I like gays. I'm not a homophobic [sic], and I'm sick of people saying that, just because I'm for traditional marriage." The media elite replied by happily tweeting the grammatical mistake.

Again, the media code is obvious: no "homophobes" in favor of traditional marriage should be allowed to star on a TV program - and certainly not in a room full of ballroom dancers. It doesn't matter if they never say a word of protest, or never plan an "educational" dance routine that honors Jesus and the ridiculed home-schooled kids who are allowed to study Him in school time.

Would it be rude to ask Chaz Bono how she would feel if ABC paired her with a male professional partner, since she was (and is) female? Not just rude, it would be insulting. In the calculus of the TV critics, Bono must be applauded for her courage, and Bristol must be brought low because she's a Palin.



that calculate it, that disseminate it. We need to be growing by 400,000 or 500, even 600,000 jobs a month, coming out of a recession. That's what's standard. That's what's normal. This isn't even a recovery. We're nowhere near a recovery. There's no strengthening going on. More and more people are becoming more dependent each day on the government. The welfare rolls -- or the dependency rolls -- are growing; they're not shrinking. And that growth is being promoted and advertised and sought by this administration.

They get all excited about gross domestic product of 1.5, 1.7%. Hey, you know what? It was revised, it was actually 1.7 last month, not 1.5, whatever they're saying. This is the United States of America that we're talking about. Our GDP ought to be 5%, 6%, 7%, not one-and-a-half, not 1.7, not 1.9. It wasn't that long ago that we had five, six, 7% GDP growth. It wasn't 50 years ago. It was ten or less, 8.3% unemployment. That means that under Barack Obama, unemployment has never been under 8%. And this is even before all of the massive tax increases that are associated with Obamacare kick in, before the massive tax increases kick in when the Bush tax rates expire in January and before the regime's massive EPA and other regulations, which are being held back until after the election, and instituted if he wins. We also lost more people from the labor force. The national unemployment rate went up, 8.2 to 8.3%. One-hundred and fifty thousand people simply dropped out of the labor force. Actually that number is 155,000, which means that this 172,000 new jobs that he's trumpeting are actually a wash, folks. No net new jobs, 195,000 fewer people employed, 150,000 simply dropped out of the labor force. That's the pattern.

The percentage of people working continues to shrink. The number of jobs available in the country continues to shrink. Well, here's how they got there. In June, according to the BLS, there had been 142.4 million people employed. In July, it's 142.2. Two-hundred thousand fewer people employed. He goes out, "We created 172,000 jobs." It's a lie when plugged in with all the other relevant data. And that's why the real unemployment rate, what's called U-6, when you include the people who've given up looking, it's now 15%, and our buddy Jim Pethokoukis has his analysis of the numbers out. We do this every month. We've been doing this every month for three years. We've been trying to hammer the truth home for three years.

Every month for three years, it's the same old thing. The regime comes out, lies big time, and everybody's trying to tell us, essentially, we've got a burgeoning, growing economy. We got the worst, there is no recovery. It's the worst recovery ever since the Great Depression. I would like for the president to have told us what's working, what it is that he's doing that's causing all this wonderful news to be reported today. He didn't take any questions. Fifteen percent is the U-6 unemployment number. Fifteen percent. And if this 8.3% number, if the labor force participation rate were today what it was when Obama was inaugurated, that number would be 11%. In fact, probably could go ahead

and call it 11% in order to try to make the point because the labor force has shrunk.

This man's economy has been so bad that there are over two million fewer jobs to have in this country. That's why everybody talks about job growth. It's not as though there are jobs unfilled out there. It's that there aren't any jobs besides those that we have. And we keep shrinking, that number keeps shrinking every month. Oh, yeah, in pockets, you can find companies with openings, people looking for work. nationwide, overall, the universe of jobs able to be filled is down by over two million. That's why job creation, new businesses, entrepreneurial growth, that's why the recipe that's called for that is what's not being done. That's why we are talking about job growth. We need to create jobs so that people have jobs to apply for. There aren't a bunch of jobs unfilled out there.

On a blog post, one of their economics writers, threw cold water before he even know what the numbers were, and he mighta known what the numbers were gonna be for all I know, threw cold water on whatever was announced today because it's really, really bad out there. The point was, it's gonna be really, really easy to misunderstand some misleading numbers that might make it look good, or better than it is. The New York Times last night, admittedly on a blog post, random act of journalism. Here's the next Obama sound bite. This is where he says, "We're not gonna get where we need to be by going back."

OBAMA: Let's acknowledge, we've still got too many folks out there who are looking for work. We've got more work to do on their behalf. Here's the thing: We are not gonna get there,

happen to anybody, for anybody. That's what's eroding. That's what's being destroyed. It used to be, the American dream, you come from nothing, it didn't matter where you were born, and didn't matter where you grew up. What mattered was you, how much did you have. And I'm talking about desire, ambition, guts, commitment. You had all that, you could write your ticket. If you didn't have any of that, you weren't gonna be writing a big ticket. It was up to you. It was up to every American. And there used to be people who inspired others. There used to be heroes that people wanted to emulate. There used to be role models that people wanted to be like. And those people generally achieved things. They were accomplished people, in whatever field. They served as role models.

Those people are now under assault in this country. They're the suspects. They are the targets. The people that show the way, the people that provide the inspiration, whether they know they're doing it or not, the people that light the path, those are the people that are the enemy to Barack Obama. I want everybody to have the chance I had. I want everybody to be able to pull off what I pulled off in whatever field of endeavor they want. Whatever success is to you, I want you to be able to reach it, however you define it. That's what's being destroyed. That's why I was talking to the 24-year-old guy yesterday who was talking about how much fun it is. I worry that he's not gonna have the opportunity to create the kind of wealth that's possible or that used to be. Or don't even look at it that way if it bothers you. To be successful as he defines it. Whatever that would be. 

A revolutionary. And as such, he believes, that is the case in all revolutions, there is a period of pain and suffering. Not by him. Not by his friends, so-called masses. No, no, no. The pain and suffering is borne by the masses. The pain and suffering is borne by the unemployment numbers, the lack of economic growth numbers. The health care debacle and disaster. That's the pain and suffering. That's the price that must be paid in order to achieve social and economic justice that has never existed in this country before. See, where we are now, folks, is that the people who have benefited from the way this country was founded, the people in this society who've gotten rich, the people in this country, the top 1%, those that have had the power, the genuine descendants of the Founding Fathers, also a bunch of rich white guys. They set it up for themselves and for other people like 'em, and they knew what they were doing. They were setting up a phony, fraudulent country to take care of only themselves and everybody else is gonna be working to make them rich.

Well, those days are over. And now we got somebody who understands social justice. And now we have somebody who understands economic justice. We have somebody who understands fairness and freedom and liberty in the right way. We have a guy now who's gonna make sure that anybody who benefited from this corrupt, immoral society now pays a price so that others might achieve. That's how he sees this country. It's not just him. That's how his staff sees the country. It's how most of the Democrat Party sees the country these days. It's not LBJ's Democrat Party. It's not your grandfather's Democrat Party anymore. It's not your grandfather's media. They all are aligned in this notion that this nation is corrupt, was founded as such, and the people that have benefited didn't really deserve it. The people that have benefited, they won life's lottery. The people that benefited, luck.

You hear it. Obama says it in his own words, using his own terminology. "Winners of life's lottery" or just luck or not paying their fair share or whatever. But now, now they're going to. That's how this man sees this country. And that's

But still, even at this point in time, to this day, folks, there are people in this country who refuse to even consider the possibility of what I just said being true. They don't want to. Many people can't conceive that somebody who thinks this way has actually been elected president. It doesn't happen. "Presidents love the country, Rush. Presidents only want what's great for the country." No, not now. We don't have a president who believes in America, not in American exceptionalism, not in the America of our founding. That's just the way it is.

I'll tell you a little story. I mentioned it at the end of the first hour, that one of the things about all this that really bothers me, I just cringe when I see opportunity being squelched and shut off for people. I really mean it when I say I want everybody to have the same opportunity I had. I love sharing good things that happen. This country is one of the greatest things that ever happened to humanity. There are people who try to take advantage of it.

RUSH: Rod in Saginaw, Michigan. We're starting with you on Open Line Friday today. Hello.

CALLER: How you doing, Rush? Thanks for taking my call.

RUSH: You bet, sir.

CALLER: And mega dittos. You know, as a true conservative, really, my philosophy is this. As you

know, the private sector is what really drives the economy. And we all know that, as a result, it's really not the government's responsibility to create jobs in the private sector, in my opinion. Instead, what I think the government can do much better is really get out of the way and allow the private sector to thrive, you know, using the fundamental capitalistic policies and principles --

He and his buddies have all the answers on virtually every problem in this country, and he's never done anything. And he doesn't even care. The idea that there's this giant compassionate blood flow going, that's not even true. Breathtaking, really, how far removed from the traditional American experience this man is. Romney was dead right about that. His life experiences do not comport with the American experience. They just don't. Rod, I appreciate the call.

Facts Don't Persuade Liberals

RUSH: Here's Lisa in Houston on the program. You're next. Great to have you here. Hi.

CALLER: Hi. Thanks, Rush. I just wanted to say that I am just frustrated and angry as you are when I watch how arrogant Obama is. It just makes me not even want to look at him. And it just makes me so mad. I don't understand why Romney and the rest of the Republicans don't throw that "fair share" thing back in their faces. You know, they say that the rich don't pay their fair share. And I think, sadly, most Americans buy into that, you know, they think, oh, yeah, that's right, they're not paying their fair share. And really, what is it, like the top 10% pay 50% of all taxes; is that right?

RUSH: Yeah, let me tell you something about that. We've had that number on our website going on five years. For 20 years I've been making the point on this program that the top 1%

pay 40%, top 5% pay 80%, whatever the number, and yet I don't think if we had never mentioned it, it would matter. This is one of those arguments where the real numbers don't, 'cause it's never enough. The left is never happy. If you could get them to agree that a tax rate of 50% was fair, the next year they'd want 60. They're very wise not to demand a number. It's not about numbers. It's about attitudes leading to votes against Republicans. That's the only reason they spout this stuff. I'm blue in the face telling people that the top 1%, top 10%, top 50%, I'm blue in the face telling people they pay their fair share and more. It doesn't register. That doesn't cut through the noise. That argument, I don't think, has ever mattered. It's never blunted it.

CALLER: See, I think if Romney were to say that in a debate, you know, if he were to ask Obama, "What percentage should someone who makes \$300,000 a year, what should they pay? What percentage should they pay of their salary, what do you think?"

RUSH: He wouldn't answer it. He wouldn't answer it. He would take the question and go off to another talking point making the same point. He would not answer it, I guarantee you.

CALLER: Well, then it just irritates me that you have these Hollywood liberals who, you know, give millions of dollars to Democrats, but then, you know, they live in these mansions and they say that rich people aren't paying enough. I guess I just have always thought, why don't those people be the first to give all of their money away? real hatred for the rich. Well, they don't want to be hated. Yet they're rich. So? They run out and they criticize the rich, as though they're not. In the process they inoculate themselves from their own criticism.

See, everybody believes that big businessmen are Republicans. That big corporate CEOs are conservatives, and they believe in individualism and self-reliance, and they don't like big government and so forth. Nothing could be further from the truth today. The people like Bill Gates and Warren Buffett run around, they both do, they run around, "There isn't enough charitable giving by the rich. They're not paying enough taxes. The rich ought to be paying more," and in the process, the richest people in the world inoculate themselves from the hatred for the rich that they are helping gin up, and people leave them alone, and that means nobody's coming for their money.



The biggest mistake in the world is to engage liberals literally on what they're talking about.

When Ted Kennedy said, "Robert Bork's America is an America were women are getting back alley --" that's not what he was saying. He was creating, trying to sustain an attitude of bigotry and hatred harbored by conservatives, pure and simple.

RUSH: Ladies and gentlemen, the liberals, the American left, the Democrat Party cannot ever allow the country to be unified. They just can't. They cannot survive without conflict. They cannot survive without chaos. They cannot survive without an us versus them. To illustrate the point, if the top marginal tax rate were moved up to 90%, it would not stop them from saying the rich aren't paying their fair share. They're going to say it if we abolish the rich. If we make it illegal to be rich. They're still gonna run around talking about the days when the rich weren't paying their fair share and do you want to go back to that.

But the fact that the Democrat Party

keeps doing it is proof positive to me that they think it works. In this case, that's all they've got.



Not that what he was saying isn't pervasive, it's just the literal aspect of this stuff, when we're talking to liberals, who is it we're trying to persuade anyway?

We're trying to talk liberals out of being liberals. Isn't that what this objective is? Or we're trying to depress 'em so much that they don't go vote, whatever. But that's what we're trying to do. But they're not literal in any way. They live an image. They live in fantasy land. They live in the world of emotion. Realville, they get nowhere near it. They see the sign that says Realville, and they turn around so that it's in the rearview mirror. They're out of there, don't want any part of it. They can't survive in Realville. They live in cocoons. Studied this. The art of persuasion is a very, very tricky thing.
