
Casino magnate and GOP donor Sheldon Adelson has <u>filed a \$60 million libel suit</u> against the National Jewish Democratic Council. The NJDC had demanded that Mitt Romney and other Republicans refuse donations from Adelson

because he had "personally approved of prostitution at his Macau resorts." The Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee repeated the same claim, but backed down in response to Adelson's threat of a lawsuit, admitting that "the statements were untrue and unfair and we retract them."

The 2012 election:

The top political news is, Republican Presidential hopeful Mitt Romney <u>picked</u> Paul Ryan as his VP running mate.


One heavily discussed <u>topic</u> this week was an Obama Super PAC Ad where there is a line drawn between Romney shutting down a steel mill and a man's wife later dying from cancer. This was despite the company being run by someone else at the time of the plant closing, the man being offered a buyout, and his wife dying in 2006, 5 years after GST Steel <u>closed down</u>.



Massachusetts Senate candidate Elizabeth Warren's daughter <u>heads</u> <u>group</u> using taxpayer money to shuttle welfare recipients to the voting booths. How convenient.

Obama campaign spokeswoman Jen Psaki acknowledged Thursday that the campaign was no longer pleading ignorance about the story of a man who has appeared in both a super PAC ad and a campaign ad. Previously, Robert Gibbs and Stephanie Cutter, Obama campaign people, claimed not to know any specifics.

The other story was that raised by Senate leader Harry Reid that possibly Romney did not pay any taxes for 10 years. Even the Washington Post gave him 4 Pinocchios for that.



Elizabeth Warren <u>demanded</u> Monday that Senator Scott Brown release more of his tax returns. The only problem was that Brown, her Republican rival, had already released six years of tax returns while Warren has refused to release more than four years of her filings.

Massachusetts <u>mails out</u> 500K voter registration forms to welfare recipients, an effort led by former ACORN execs and the NAACP. Hmmm, and which party would this benefit?

A nonpartisan election integrity group has sent legal notices to <u>160 counties</u> across the U.S. that it says have more voters on its registration rolls

than actual live, eligible voters - and thus represent potential hotbeds for election fraud, the organization told TheBlaze exclusively.

Labor unions plan to <u>send out</u> more than 300,000 volunteers later this month to canvass voters to support President Barack Obama's re-election.

Obama <u>chooses</u> Sandra Fluke to introduce him at a rally.



The economy:

Left-leaning economists often argue that the \$800 billion American Recovery and Reinvestment Act was too small and that more stimulus is needed to get the economy going again. The real amount of fiscal stimulus pumped into the economy, however, may be much higher. Tom Firey of the libertarian Cato Institute estimates that the U.S. has dumped at least \$2.5 trillion of fiscal stimulus into the economy since 2008.

A pro-amnesty group is <u>forecasting</u> that up to 1.76 million young illegal immigrants would get work permits under President Barack Obama's de facto amnesty announced in June, amid a stalled

economy and near-record levels of unemployment.

Some time ago, the feds raided two Gibson Guitar manufacturing locations, over suspicion of the importation of illegal wood. The fed came into both locations brandishing firearms. Gibson had someone hired to make certain that what they did is legal. Gibson agreed to pay \$300,000. Their legal fees so far were around \$2.5 million and a court decision would cause them to pay twice that amount for the legal defense. As the government concedes in the agreement, "certain questions and inconsistencies now exist regarding" the legality of the Indian wood. Consequently, the government has resolved that it "will not undertake enforcement actions related to Gibson's future orders, purchases, or imports of [wood] from India, unless and until the Government of India provides specific clarification" regarding its legality or illegality. This sounds a lot to me like, the government is not sure now if Gibson did anything wrong, but, they did get a settlement out of Gibson.

Our government at work:

Transgender activists are cheering a new memo from the Department of Health and Human Services that will bar health care <u>discrimination</u> against transgendered people by companies receiving federal dollars. This could potentially drive up healthcare costs tremendously.

Local matters:

Poway Unified School District in the San Diego, CA area, has done what, at first <u>appears to be</u> a normal bond issue. In 2008, voters had given the district permission to borrow more money to finish its modernization, and they had received a big promise from the elected school board in return: No tax increases. But they were creative, so that they would pay back interest only for a long period of time. So, for borrowing \$105 million in 2011, taxpayers will end up paying

investors more than \$981 million by 2051, or almost 10 times what the district borrowed. That's wildly more expensive than a typical school bond, in which a district pays back two or maybe three times what it borrowed.

Massachusetts Sen. Scott Brown <u>slammed</u> his own state for spending \$275,000 on what he described as a politically motivated push to send voter registration letters to people on welfare.

Joan Rivers seems to think her <u>first</u> <u>amendment</u> <u>rights</u> insure that she can get her book offered for sale at Costco.

Liberals love irony:

Female employees of the Democratic National Committee (DNC) earn significantly less than their male counterparts, a Washington Free Beacon analysis has found.



News off the news grid:

President Obama is <u>fast-tracking</u> seven federal wind and solar projects as the administration touts its energy policies amid GOP criticism over green investments and rising gas prices.

Yesterday's news...

Rep. Allen West reportedly offended the entire Congressional Black Caucus when he delivered a selection of <u>Chick-fil-A</u> chicken and biscuits to the members' weekly meeting. CBC Chairman Rep. Alcee Hastings (D-FL) told The Huffington Post that, despite the incident happening six months ago, it is still fresh in their minds and every member was offended.

Emails obtained by The Daily Caller show that the U.S. Treasury Department, led by Timothy Geithner, was the <u>driving</u> <u>force</u> behind terminating the pensions of 20,000 salaried

retirees at the Delphi auto parts manufacturing company.

President Obama's staff <u>arranged</u> for him to be personally briefed last summer on a loan program to help clean-energy companies, two months before the program was thrust into headlines by the collapse of its flagship, the solar company Solyndra, records show.

Three American special forces soldiers were shot dead by a man in Afghan uniform in what appeared to be the latest incident of local forces turning their weapons on their foreign allies. The Americans were killed after being invited to dinner to discuss security in Sangin district of Helmand on Thursday evening.

The Islamic Religious Council in Malaysia criminally <u>prosecute</u> non-Muslims for trying to spread their faith among Muslims in the country. Malaysia is known as one of the moderate Muslim countries.

Iraqi authorities are on the verge of releasing a leading Shi'ite terrorist wanted by the United States for the killing of American soldiers there, but the Obama administration maintains that the U.S. has "a good and robust and strategic partnership" with Baghdad. The case of Ali Musa Daqduq, one of the most senior Hezbollah figures ever to have been in U.S. custody, threatens to become a heated political issue in the U.S., with Republican critics accusing the administration of botching the affair.

At least 3,898 people have <u>lost their lives</u> in terrorist violence in Pakistan during the first seven months of the year.

The Obama administration, in a move aimed at reviving Afghan peace talks, has sweetened a proposed deal under which it would <u>transfer</u> Taliban detainees from Guantanamo Bay prison in exchange for a U.S. soldier held by Taliban allies in Pakistan.




Liberals on the economy:

Liberal war on Christianity:




Muslims:





110,000 million individuals received a <u>welfare</u> benefit in 2011. (These figures do not include other means-tested benefits such as the Earned Income Tax Credit or the health insurance premium subsidies included in the President's health care law. CBO estimates that the premium subsidies, scheduled to begin in 2014, will cover at least 25 million individuals by the end of the decade.



The U.S. economy <u>lost</u> 1.2 million jobs between June and July. But that's not how it got reported. When the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) released its jobs figures for July, it said the economy gained 163,000 jobs. The discrepancy just has to do with what's known as "seasonal adjustments."

There are 79 means-tested federal welfare programs, at a cost approaching \$1 trillion annually. This is an increase of 19% under President Obama.

We have heard over and over again that the rich must begin paying their fair share, which, according to Obama, will raise the tax revenue enough to run the country for less than two weeks. Yet, at the same time, for tax year 2010, the IRS processed over 3 million tax returns with -- seeking refunds in excess of \$7 billion. And these were using I-10s (not a social security number, but a number assigned to non-citizens). 154 mailing addresses were used 1,000 or more times on I-10 applications. Over 24,000 refunds were sought at a particular address, one address, seeking refunds of over \$46 million. 10 individual addresses were used for filing 53,994 tax returns

resulting in the processing of \$86.4 million in fraudulent tax refunds. So, we have billions of dollars going out the door to give refunds and tax credits to people who may not even exist, and who definitely do not deserve such refunds and credits, and yet, President Obama is concerned about getting a similar amount out of the rich. All he'd have to do is tighten down tax returns to get the same revenue.

You want to meet the president? Can't do that for \$3 anymore; he wants \$5. Suck it up and give.



A Little Bias





Obama Denies Gutting Welfare Reform by Amy Payne

The Obama Administration came out swinging against its critics on welfare reform yesterday, with Press Secretary Jay Carney saying the charge that the Administration gutted the successful 1996 reform's work requirements is "categorically false" and "blatantly dishonest." Even former President Bill Clinton, who signed the reform into law, came out parroting the Obama team's talking points and saying the charge was "not true."

The Heritage Foundation's Robert Rector and Kiki Bradley first <u>broke the story</u> on July 12 that Obama's Health and Human Services Department (HHS) had rewritten the Clinton-era reform to undo the work requirements, in a move that legal experts Todd Gaziano and Robert Alt determined was patently illegal.

The Administration's new argument has two parts: denying the Obama Administration's actions and claiming that Republican governors, including Mitt Romney, tried to do the same thing. In essence, "We did not do what you're saying, but even if we did, some Republicans did it, too." Both parts of this argument are easily debunked.

Obama Administration Claim #1: We Didn't Gut Work Requirements

Ever since the 1996 law passed, Democratic leaders have attempted (unsuccessfully) to repeal welfare's work standards, blocking reauthorization of the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program (TANF) and attempting to weaken the requirements. Unable to eliminate "workfare" legislatively, the Obama HHS claimed authority to grant waivers that allow states to get around the work requirements.

Humorously, HHS Secretary Kathleen Sebelius now asserts that the Administration abolished the TANF work requirements to increase work.

HHS now claims that states receiving a waiver must "commit that their proposals will move at least 20 percent more people from welfare to work compared to the state's prior performance." But given the normal turnover rate in welfare programs, the easiest way to increase the number of people moving from "welfare to work" is to increase the number entering welfare in the first place.

Bogus statistical ploys like these were the norm before the 1996 reform. The law curtailed use of sham measures of success and established meaningful standards: Participating in work activities meant actual work activities, not "bed rest" or "reading" or doing one hour of job search per month; reducing welfare dependence meant reducing caseloads. Now those standards are gone.

Obama's HHS claims authority to overhaul every aspect of the TANF work provisions (contained in section 407), including "definitions of work activities and engagement, specified limitations, verification procedures and the calculation of participation rates." In other words, the whole work program. Sebelius's HHS bureaucracy declared the existing TANF law a blank slate on which it can design any policy it chooses.

Obama Administration Claim #2: Even If We Did, the Republicans Tried It, Too

Though the Obama Administration is claiming it is not trying to get around the work requirements, it is also claiming that a group of Republican governors tried to do the same thing in 2005. Clinton also said in his statement yesterday that "the recently announced waiver policy was originally requested" by Republican governors.

Heritage welfare expert Robert Rector addressed this claim back on July 19. As Rector explains:

But [the governors'] letter makes no mention at all of waiving work requirements under the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program. In fact, the legislation promoted in the letter-the Personal Responsibility and Individual Development for Everyone (PRIDE) Act-actually would have toughened the federal work standards. It proposed raising the mandatory participation rates imposed on states from 50 percent to 70 percent of the adult TANF caseload and increasing the hours of required work activity.

The governors' letter actually contradicts the Administration's main argument: If the law has always permitted HHS to waive the work requirements, then why didn't the governors just request waivers from then-President George W. Bush? Why would legislation be needed?

Two reasons: First, it has been clear for 15 years that the TANF law did not permit HHS to waive the work requirements. Second, the Republican governors were not seeking to waive the work requirements in the first place.

Obama's Evolution from Welfare to Work and Back

President Obama had a convenient change of heart regarding welfare reform when it was time to run for President. In 1998, when he was an Illinois state senator, Obama said:

I was not a huge supporter of the federal plan that was signed in 1996. Having said that, I do think that there is a potential political opportunity that arose out of welfare reform. And that is to desegregate the welfare population-meaning the undeserving poor, black folks in cities, from the working poor-deserving, white, rural as well as suburban.

The same year, he reiterated that "the 1996 legislation I did not entirely agree with and probably would have voted against at the federal level."

But in 2008, when he was running for President, Obama said he had changed his mind about welfare reform: "I was much more concerned 10 years ago when President Clinton initially signed the bill that this could have disastrous results..It had-it worked better than, I think, a lot of people anticipated. And, you know, one of the things that I am absolutely convinced of is that we have to work as a centerpiece of any social policy."

One of his 2008 campaign ads <u>touted</u> "the Obama record: moved people from welfare to work" and promised that as President, he would "never forget the dignity that comes from work."

This evolution is unsurprising, considering the <u>vast majority of Americans</u> favor requiring welfare recipients to work.

President Obama has finally accomplished what Democrats have been trying to do for years. He has even gotten President Clinton to turn his back on one of the <u>signature</u> <u>achievements</u> of his Administration to give him political cover-which Clinton was quick to do. In 1996, Clinton had to compromise and allow the tough work requirements to get the legislation passed.

Both Presidents have now revealed their true feelings about welfare-and there's no denying it.

A big change in America

Under President Obama, the USA has greatly increased social welfare programs. The President will tell you that's because it's a bad recession. But we've gone through bad recessions before. Never, never had the amount of dependence on the federal government that we have now.

ANNOUNCER: In 1996, President Clinton and a bipartisan Congress helped end welfare as we know it, by requiring work for welfare.

RUSH: Big deal.

ANNOUNCER: But on July 12th, President Obama quietly announced a plan to gut welfare reform by dropping work requirements. Under Obama's plan, you wouldn't have to work and wouldn't have to train for a job. They'd just send you your welfare check. And welfare-to-work goes back to being plain old welfare. Mitt Romney will restore the work requirement because it works.

RUSH: They are over the moon angry at this and maybe they're upset 'cause he's talking about all the bipartisanship. Hell, I don't know. I think that's the least important factor in all of this. But still, here's the spokeskid, Jay Carney, yesterday afternoon at the White House, Q&A. Reporter said, "The Romney campaign came out with a new ad accusing the president of gutting welfare reform, said the administration's turned welfare into a blank check for states without any work requirements. This waiver policy that we're discussing was specifically requested by two Republican governors, Governor Herbert of Utah and Governor Sandoval of Nevada.

RUSH: Now, they're fit to be tied. But Obama did all this in secret. If this is such a wonderful thing, why didn't he call a press conference, or at least, if not a press conference, a big event in the Rose Garden and signal this and tell everybody all these wonderful benefits and lay this off on these two Republican governors who wanted waivers from this. Why not do it, instead of doing it under the cover of darkness, on a weekend, where nobody could see it, and you announce it later that it's done.

Axelrod was calling it racist. Now he's calling it blatantly dishonest and an attack. I mean they got people fanning out all over the place on this. On Piers Morgan last night, the guy who's lost over 70% of Larry King's audience, and it was no great shakes to begin with, Piers Morgan talking to Obama campaign press secretary Ben LaBolt, not to be confused with Usain Bolt. Did you see what he did, by the way? The track guy. The guy ran a hundred meters in five seconds, faster than you can send the text on your iPhone. He ran the hundred meters in under ten seconds.

Anyway, he was being interviewed by some sports babe, and the national anthem starts at a medal ceremony somewhere else at the other end of the track, did not involve him, he's from Jamaica, but he stopped, put his hand over his heart, faced the flag, stopped his own interview for our national anthem, Usain Bolt. Obama wouldn't do that. So, anyway, this is Ben LaBolt, and Piers Morgan said, "Apparently, you're dishing out all sorts of handouts to people that

don't deserve it here. Expanding welfare to a basic giveaway program. What about that?"

LABOLT: This latest attack is false, and it's hypocritical. The entire purpose of this program is move more people from welfare-to-work. If there's a state that can design a more effective program and prove to the federal government that they can move 20% more people from welfare-to-work, we'll act on it. The governors who requested this are Republican governors in the states of Nevada and Utah who said they could design more effective programs.

RUSH: Problem with this is, Obama doesn't want to put people back to work. Obama wants to overwhelm this country with welfare recipients. That's the fastest way to bring about the transformation that he wants. Over on CBS This Morning, Jan Crawford and her report on the Romney welfare reform ad.

CRAWFORD: Romney's message is part of a broader theme the campaign will be hitting hard in coming weeks, arguing that President Obama is in fact changing America by making more people depend on big government to take care of them while hardworking taxpayers foot the bill. Now, in a campaign that's already tinged with class welfare and attacks on Romney's wealth, this could be a potent counter message with independents in these key to swing states.

RUSH: So it could be a potent message, a really hard-hitting message out there. It could really change the minds of the independents. So they're going nuts over this no matter where you go, over Romney's little welfare reform ad.

And I gotta take a break. Time goes by.

RUSH: Robert Rector of the Heritage Foundation said the governors of these two states Jay Carney cited, Utah and Nevada, did not seek waivers of the work requirement. The Obama administration is just lying about that. By the

way, it's a little bit disconcerting to me to keep hearing Bill Clinton get credit for this. You know who wrote welfare reform? Do you know who actually wrote the legislation? Santorum. Rick Santorum was the primary author of welfare reform, and there's Bill Clinton out there getting the credit for it.

(impression) "Back in the 1990s, President Bill Clinton -- working with the Republicans in Congress in a bipartisan fashion -- passed welfare reform with a work requirements for freeloaders out there sitting on their butts all day." Clinton was dragged kicking and screaming to this! Bill Clinton wasn't the author of welfare reform. He never got close to writing it. He detested it, including the day that he signed it into law. And now the guy who actually wrote it, Santorum, is never even discussed.

Here's Terry in Dayton, Ohio. We go back to the phones. Great to have you here. Hi.

CALLER: God bless you and Kathryn, Rush. I love you.

RUSH: Thank you, sir.

CALLER: Rush, is there really this huge group of undecideds out here? If you had to vote tomorrow, I think most people know who they'd vote for. Who benefits by the speculation that there's this large group of undecideds and the race is so close, besides the advertisers?

RUSH: Well, you've got me. What do you think? Answer your own question for me. Who does benefit?

CALLER: Well, I think advertisers definitely benefit. The news, you know? It's a close race and there's a lot of people who haven't made up their minds yet.

RUSH: Wait a minute.

CALLER: So the candidates keep spending the money.

RUSH: Are you trying to tell me that advertisers are telling news people to continue to project this thing as undecided, that there are a lot of undecideds --

CALLER: (groans)

RUSH: So that people will watch the news

programs?

CALLER: (chuckles) Oh, gee.

RUSH: I don't think it's happening that way. The thing I saw yesterday, if I can remember the numbers, it was confusing when I looked at 'em the first time. It's the number of voters for Obama that are abandoning him. I think he's lost... (sigh) Oh, I forget. Fourteen percent? I think 14% of people that were gonna vote for Obama are not gonna vote for him, in a poll that I saw yesterday. Obama lost 14%, but the Republicans lost some, too. It was a weird thing.

The GOP candidate lost 7%. In other words, 7% who voted Republican last time said they're not going to this time, and 14% who said they voted for Obama in '08 are not going to this time around. Now, this phenomenon... See, this guy, Terry, is out there, and he's like me. "How can you be undecided in the midst of this?" (laughs) I know. Common sense rears its head, and you say, "How can anybody be undecided?" I take it a step farther.

Bob Schieffer talked with Charlie Rose today on CBS on the CBS This Morning show about this ad, and Charlie Rose said, "It's getting hotter out there, isn't it?" Now, they're talking about Romney's ad. They're not talking about Obama's ad accusing Romney of killing a guy's wife. No, no. They're talking about Romney's ad accusing Obama of taking work requirements out of welfare. Charlie said, "Boy, it's really getting hot out there, isn't it," Bob, old buddy, old pal?

SCHIEFFER: You see where Mitt Romney is going here. I mean, if you look at these new battleground polls that are out, he does best with, eh, white, working-class men. And this is aimed, uh, directly at that group. But I think it's quite interesting how vehemently both the White House and Bill Clinton are denying this. Bill Clinton is pointing out that, you know, it was Republican governors who were asking for these waivers. And he points out that, uh, when this welfare law went into effect, uh, Mitt Romney himself, as a governor, asked for some waivers, uh, in order to make adjustments in the work requirement.

RUSH: Yeah. Well, again, Robert Rector of the Heritage Foundation says that all this gobbledygook about Republican governors requesting waivers from these very stringent work requirements just isn't true. And here's Clinton carrying the lie forward. I'm playing these sound bites for you just to illustrate that, for some odd reason, this Romney ad has got these people turned upside down. I want you to go back and grab the ad. Grab number 13.

I have to tell you, Snerdley's saying, "You know everything, Rush. You have every political answer. What is it about this ad that's got the Democrats and the media so out of sorts?" And right now, I don't know. Here's the ad again. You tell me! What is in this ad that has caused Obama

and Jay Carney and Ben LaBolt and Charlie Rose and Bob Schieffer and everybody else in the media to go absolutely batty?

ANNOUNCER: In 1996, President Clinton and a bipartisan Congress helped end welfare as we know it, by requiring work-for-welfare. But on July 12th, President Obama quietly announced a plan to gut welfare reform by dropping work requirements. Under Obama's plan, you wouldn't have to work and wouldn't have to train for a job. They'd just send you your welfare check. And welfare-to-work goes back to being plain old welfare. Mitt Romney will restore the work requirement because it works.

RUSH: Now, one of the only things I can figure is that the thing that drives them the craziest is when you tell the truth about them. And this ad does tell the truth in the sense that Obama's gutting the work requirements of welfare reform. I literally can't figure out why they're upset, 'cause there's nothing defamatory in it. There's nothing untrue about it. It doesn't even approach "Obama killed that guy's wife." It doesn't get anywhere near that, and yet they're doing damage control on this like I haven't seen 'em do damage control, except on, (impression), "You didn't build that. You didn't make that happen."

It took 'em awhile to get up to speed, but after they figured out that they were reeling from that, then they went nuts on that, and this is basically the same thing. Except the Romney camp does not tie them together. I'm doing that myself. The Romney ad does not say, for example, "Last week President Obama said, 'You didn't build that small business. You didn't do that on your own,' and now he's saying this." But they must be afraid of the linkage because Obama did go out and say (impression), "You didn't build that! You didn't make that happen. Your small business, you had nothing to do with that! Other people built that! Other people made your business happen. You didn't do that. Roads and bridges did that!"



And here comes, a couple of weeks later, an ad in which Romney basically says: "Yep, Obama is on the side of the freeloaders. Obama is making it easier on the freeloaders, to freeload. Obama's making it easier on the takers to take. Obama's on their side. Obama is against the producers." If it's not that -- and maybe it is that, and the fact that the other thing got so much traction when they hit Obama so hard on, "You didn't build that." This is just, essentially, a continuation of it without Romney establishing any linkage.

If it's not that, folks, I don't know what has 'em up in arms.

See, I Told You So: Obama Says He Wants to Repeat Auto Takeover in Every Industry

RUSH: Have you heard Obama? He said: "I want to nationalize other industries just like I did General Motors and Chrysler." Yeah. He didn't just come out and admit it, he came out and advocated it. He suggested it and talked about how he could do it and "save" other industries like he has "saved" the automobile industry. I kid you not. I have it here near the top of the Stack and an audio sound bite.

I'll take you back. This is me April 28, 2009, shortly after the stimulus bill, and this is after Obama has taken over General Motors and Chrysler. He gave those companies to the unions. The Chrysler and GM bondholders rank higher than stockholders in terms of who gets paid in a bankruptcy or who gets their investment paid back first. The bondholders are first.

Obama told them to take a hike. Obama called them greedy for wanting a return on their investment. Not even a return; they just wanted their money back! And Obama said (paraphrased), "Get the hell out. You're greedy. Who the hell are you guys?" And he gave the companies to the autoworkers, essentially. So back on April 28, 2009, I, El Rushbo, said this...

RUSH ARCHIVE: This was the game plan all along. It's not Obama's answer to every problem. It's his objective: Nationalize every business. It's not his solution. It's his objective.

RUSH: That was key. That's the key difference. "It's not a solution to a problem. It's his objective." This is what he intends. That's April 28, 2009. This is when everybody is still roiling in controversy over the fact I said, three months prior to that, that I hoped Obama failed. Because I knew what was coming. OBAMA: So now I want to do the same thing with manufacturing jobs. Not just in the auto industry, but in every industry.


RUSH: In every industry I want to do what I did for jobs in General Motors.

It's not number one. They're not making money. It's just another in a long line of blatant lies. But here he's being honest. I think this has the potential (not quite, but it has the potential) to be, "You didn't build that. You didn't make that." And, by the way, where has that gone? Did you notice that all this stuff that Romney didn't pay

his taxes and "Romney killed my wife!" popped up after that?

You notice that that whole incident from July 13th at Roanoke just vanished?

Obama said (paraphrased), "You didn't build that. You didn't make that happen. The roads and bridges made that happen!" He was getting creamed on that. It was really hurting. And it's gone. It vanished out there into the ether. Nobody's talking about it except for I, El Rushbo. I'm now bringing it back up and reminding people. No, instead what we've been talking about is, "Romney killed a guy's wife! Romney is being unfair to Obama's welfare ad!"



And now here's Obama: "I want to do the same thing with manufacturing jobs, not just the auto industry, every industry!" (I want to be Hugo Chavez.) Does this include the oil industry, for example? Does this include the national gas industry? Does Obama want to take over Apple? You know, folks, if you hate Apple (or if you hate me talking about Apple) then you better support Obama taking it over because he'll kill it and that will be the end of it.

RUSH: Folks, he's serious. Barack Obama is serious. "I want to do the same thing with manufacturing jobs. Not just in the auto industry, in every industry." Does that mean, for example, that Obama...? And you watch, by the way, if anybody on television picks this up. It might have happened last night. Today. On the Sunday shows or next week, if anybody on our side on television engages to have a serious discussion on it and to take Obama at his word, you watch how they'll be pooh-poohed.



You watch.

"Come on! Do you really don't think Obama meant he wants to take over every industry? Who are you? You're just another right-wing maniac." That's what he said: "Now I want to do the same thing with manufacturing jobs. Not just the auto industry, but every industry. The auto industry came roaring back. GM is number one. I want to do the same thing." He'll argue, "I didn't mean taking it over. I want to offer my unique brand of fixing it. My unique way of fixing it," but that's not what happened and that's not what he means.

What he really means is what he said: He wants to take them over. He wants to assume ownership of these things on behalf of the federal government to, quote/unquote, "fix" them and do whatever. And you watch: Anybody who endeavors to take him seriously is going to be mocked and made fun of. "Don't be ridiculous! You're another one of these nuts. You may as well be a birther." They'll try to

intimidate and make fun of these people to get them to shut up.

And I predict there won't be a whole lot of people taking this as seriously as they should be. I'm talking just about the campaign issue. This is a made-to-order campaign issue for anybody who has the chutzpah to look at this ideologically. How long has it been that I've been advocating that the Republican Party -- and that everybody -- learn to look at people ideologically? Their ideas define them. Their ideology tells you all that you need to know about them. In other words, the more people...

How long have I been saying this? How many years have I been saying this? The more you can look at somebody this way, if you know that they are a liberal, that that tells you what you need to know about them. Especially if they're involved in politics. But it doesn't matter if they're not. Even if they're just the neighborhood grocery store bagger or whatever, if you know they're a liberal and you know how they're going to vote. You know what they're going to do and how they think socially.

You know.

And that's a supreme advantage!

Most people don't want to look at other people that way or don't know how or think that for some reason it's labeling somebody. When it isn't! Defining properly (understanding, analyzing, whatever) someone's ideology is all you need. And the more people who understood liberalism ideologically, the easier and greater opportunity we'd have to beat them. So here's Obama: I want to repeat that. I want to take over every industry! Okay, who is he? We know who he is. We know what he's done in 3-1/2 years.

We know what he doesn't like about America.

We know what he's tried to fix (ostensibly) and has broken, and has made worse. We now know who Obama is. We know he's not this Messiah, The One, the unique, never-before-seen-in-politics-before figure that they gave us in 2008. We know. So he's just given us a present. It's a great gift. "I want to take over every industry just like I did with the automobiles." So if the Romney campaign could translate this ideologically and use this to help people understand exactly who is Obama on everything?

They could really move the ball forward.

Looking at people's ideology, looking at their ideas -- not their party ID, and not their image, and not the way the press has created the PR about them -- their ideology. This has been a topic of mine. I don't know how many years I've been talking about this, but it has been many. And this is a great opportunity. This comes right after, "You didn't build that. You didn't make that happen." You put this together with that and it's a great opportunity for Romney and the whole Republican campaign, if they know what to do with it.

RUSH: In January 2011, General Motors stock price was \$38.98. Today, it's just over \$20 a share. Today, General Motors owes American taxpayers \$40 billion. The stock market has been doing quite well. So what happened? Obama and his union pals are in charge of this great success story. He wants to do this to every other American industry. We haven't been paid back for the bailout yet! The stock price is a little bit more than half of what it was just 18 months ago.

General Motors owes \$27 billion on the \$50 billion it got from the bailout. The lending arm, Allied Bank, owes \$15 billion of the \$17 billion that it got from the taxpayers. And Obama is out bragging about this! He's threatening to do more of the same. He's not even threatening. I think his audience loves hearing this stuff. Because,

remember, his audience thinks he did save General Motors. He goes out and tells them GM is number one, and they believe it. How about just a little stroll down memory lane?

TARP was promised to "save" our banking industry.

That's what we were told.

That's what we were sold.

And magically it turned into a slush fund!

It's a slush fund for President Crony Capitalism to bail out his donors and supporters. You remember President Bush actually proposed using some of the TARP money to save the car companies, but used in conjunction with existing bankruptcy law. But our newly immaculated president took over and, working with the tax cheat Timmy Geithner at the Treasury department, just took over General Motors and gave half of the company back to the UAW. And, by the way, speaking of banking?

Hang in there. Hang in there, folks, because we're being told that another bank crisis is just around the corner. The five US banks have been told that we are in big trouble again. It's a story that makes me think the whole thing is being set up to happen again. I don't know. This perverted process of "saving" General Motors has cost billions of dollars and now Obama is out warning the country that every other industry he crushes will get the same treatment!

He'll go out, wreak havoc on an industry -- which is what his plan is! Wreak havoc on it just like any other government program. You wreak havoc on Social Security and say, "I have to fix it." You wreak havoc on a business, you regulate it to death, you tax it to death. Of course it's never said that this is what you're doing. You're trying to help. You're trying to make sure the rich don't get away with everything. You're trying to save

the middle class. You're trying to protect middle class jobs.

You're trying to create middle class jobs!

What you really do is you go out and you regulate these businesses out of business. You regulate them with Obamacare and new tax law, and then as these industries and the businesses in them start getting into real trouble, then you -- Obama, the destroyer -- go in as Robin Hood, the White Knight, and you're going to save the day! And the American people applaud! "He cares!" The architect of the problem, Barack Obama (and his Democrat Party target an industry) wreak great damage on it, and then volunteer to "save" it like they did the auto industry by taking it over.

And that perverted process has cost taxpayers billions of dollars. The president is warning the country that every other industry he crushes will get the same treatment. And what is one of the next industries to get this treatment? The private health insurance industry. That's one-sixth of the economy. That's going to be nationalized. That's already been done. That's Obamacare. Private sector health insurance, within three years, is gone. Starting in 2014, the private sector insurance business industry is gone.

And next how about the coal industry? We have coal mining companies all over this country shutting down. They can't stay in business. They are being targeted by Obama. He has said that he intended to target them. (impression) "Well, you can build a coal-fired plant if you want, but, uh, you're going to lose money because the taxes I'm going to charge you will run you out of business." He said this! We've played the sound bite over and over again. So if the government ran the coal mines, well, everything would work out just fine! Just like the auto industry. Just like the private health

insurance industry is going to be. Oh, yeah, all these things are going to get fixed. Yeah, we're all going to be driving Chevrolet Volts and standing in line like Third World-type countries in order to get health care. And then when it comes to heat or cool our homes and buildings?

I don't even want to think about it. It's going to be India. It's going to be India. (interruption) What do you mean, "We'd never stand for it"? We're standing for it and watching it all happen! What do you mean won't stand for it to happen? We're watching it happen! We're watching it happen all over the place. We watched the auto industry go bye-bye. We are watching the private health insurance industry go bye-bye. We do nothing when he targets coal and puts a moratorium on oil.

We don't do anything.

We don't do diddly-squat!

What do you mean we wouldn't allow it to happen?

It is happening, right before our eyes, right under our noses.

Of the Indian population, 620 or 650 million people were without power. And you know one of the reasons why? Is because India is toying around with the idea that coal is bad and they're playing around with wind and solar and all this. They are not upgrading their grid. Asia isn't upgrading its grid. We're not upgrading our grid. We're not equipped to fuel our economy. The Indian economy, the Chi Com economy, they're both growing pretty rapidly. They're putting an incredible strain on the fossil fuel power production industry, and we've got plenty of fossil fuels.

We've got fuel! There's no shortage.

All of this is a manufactured panic, but everybody's falling for it. I'll tell you one thing that isn't going to happen: The ChiComs and the Indians are not going to voluntarily slow down their economies in order to make sure they don't have power outages. They'll just have the power outages. What are the people going to do? Look, 650 million people were out of power and what did they do? They accepted it! What else could they do?

California was just told, "We're going to take you off the grid."

It's 90 degrees!

"We're going to have to take some of you people off the grid. We're going to ask you voluntarily at first, in the afternoons, to watch your thermostat." Well, we've had people lose power here. People lost power for a week in the nation's capital. What do they do? What did they do? "Wah, wah, waaaah!" You say we won't stand for it? We're standing for the auto industry being taken over. We're standing for the private sector health insurance and health care industry to be taken over and destroyed. We're watching 55%, 60% of the American people, in poll after poll, opposing Obamacare, but it's happening.

What do you mean we won't stand for it?

Who's standing up to stop it?

Let me take a brief timeout while you chew your cud over that. I'm going to find this bank story, I know I had it here.

RUSH: Reuters story: "US regulators directed five of the country's biggest banks, including Bank of America Corp and Goldman Sachs Group Inc, to develop plans for staving off collapse if they faced serious problems, emphasizing that the banks could not count on government help. The two-year-old program, which has been largely secret until now, is in addition to the 'living wills'

the banks crafted to help regulators dismantle them if they actually do fail.

"It shows how hard regulators are working to ensure that banks have plans for worst-case scenarios and can act rationally in times of distress." Well, let me boil this down for you: US regulators are telling banks to make plans for preventing a collapse. Why would they be doing that now? (New Castrati impression) "That's right, Mr. Limbaugh! Because, don't you see, banks should be planning for this each and every day? It's always possible that banks could collapse." Yeah, but warning them to be ready now?

Make plans NOW to prevent a collapse?

"They told banks to consider drastic efforts to prevent failure in times of distress, including selling off businesses, finding other funding sources if regular borrowing markets shut them out, and reducing risk. The plans must be feasible to execute within three to six months, and banks were to 'make no assumption of extraordinary support from the public sector,' according to the documents." Meaning: We ain't bailing you out. The public sector is the government and we ain't bailing you out.

You better be making plans to prevent collapse. And if it happens, you better be able to handle it on your own or else you're all going to end up like Lehman Brothers. And then we're going to have a movie made about each of you. And then the country is never, ever, going to elect a Republican again, because every bank is going to be portrayed as having been run by a Romney-type guy. Why would they be warning the banks, "You better get your disaster plans in order -- and, by the way, you can't count on the government"?

Now, the government, what are they supposed to do? Protect the economy? If there's another collapse, these guys can't count on the government? I know that they want us to believe,

"That's good, Rush. The government's not going to bail out the banks." I understand all that. I agree with this. This is another threat, though. I think... I'm just throwing this out there. It's probably very unlikely. But I saw a story the other day that all of these banks that donated money to Obama are not doing so this year.

Goldman Sachs, Merrill Lynch, and all these idiots that threw in with Obama and practically every dollar they donated in '08 went to him? It's now not going to Obama. Well, this is the kind of thing that might result from it. "Oh, okay. You don't see fit to contribute to me? Fine. You better get ready for the next disaster. Remember, I can cause them. And if it happens, you're not getting bailed out." In other words, if there's another collapse... You put together what he just said in Pueblo, Colorado.

"If there's another collapse, I'm going to run your bank. I'm going to come in and take your bank just like I took General Motors."

That's what the guy is.

That's what he's saying.

Don't doubt me.

Again, folks, none of this would be a big, big threat if people just had the ability and the wherewithal to look at Obama ideologically and understand what that means. "Mitt Romney's preferred argument, however, is stewardship. ... The ideological case, on the other hand, is not just appealing to a center-right country with twice as many conservatives as liberals, it is also explanatory." Thank God somebody has joined my refrain here, folks. Ah! I can't... I can't tell you how excited this makes me. I did not know this. Krauthammer is on board with going after the ideology! Finally, somebody besides me!

Oh, this makes my day!

"The ideological case, on the other hand, is not just appealing to a center-right country with twice as many conservatives as liberals, it is also explanatory." Yes! "It underpins the stewardship argument. Obama's ideology..." YES!!! (clapping) Folks, I'm ...I'm near orgasm time here! Do you know what it's like to be all alone on this stuff? No, no, no. I know you understand. How many years have I been talking about this?

(interruption)

Snerdley is saying, "Everybody's afraid to talk about his ideology." It was his ideology that made me say I wanted him to fail. How else did I know that this was going to happen? How could I know? "How did you know, Rush?" His ideology! He's a liberal! Liberalism means things. Words mean things. Ideas have consequences. Idea-ology! He's a liberal. This was not hard to figure out. So you're saying that people were simply afraid to say this?

(interruption)

Well, okay. Snerdley's theory is there's been a lot of fear to talk about Obama's ideology because once you talk about his ideology, then you've got to talk about where he got it. And that means you have to talk about Reverend Wright and Frank Marshall Davis, I assume, and people don't want to do that. You have to talk about all the stuff that people didn't want to talk about

regarding Obama, and still don't want to. Okay. Well, I'm telling you, all there is to Obama IS his ideology.

The "stewardship" (i.e., the things he's done) is explained by his ideology. He's defined by it! He's defined by liberalism or Marxism, socialism, whatever you want to call it. See, to me, folks, this has been... Don't misunderstand me on this. It's been simple, and I know it is for you too. You know what this cuts to? This actually... We can make a linkage to what I was talking about before the break at the bottom of the hour.

I really have been thinking about the difference between the Democrat Party and the Republican Party, just looking at it this way. And when Byron York asked me, "Why does everybody always surround Obama to protect him? Why do they circle the wagons? Why don't the Republicans do it?" It's because we're not unified. We don't have the same purpose. This is an illustration of the divide.

There are some Republicans who will simply refuse to look at Obama ideologically because, maybe, they're not conservatives themselves. They're RINOs or they're moderates or what have you. And you and I have discussed, profoundly and deeply during the Republican primaries, how even members of the Republican establishment don't like conservatives. They associate conservatism with Goldwater's landslide defeat, not Reagan's landslide victories.

But this is a "Hosanna!" moment.

Here's more Krauthammer. "Second, radical reform of health care that would reduce its ruinously accelerating cost: 'Put simply,' he said, 'our health-care problem is our deficit problem' -- a financial hemorrhage drowning us in debt. Except that Obamacare adds to spending. The Congressional Budget Office reports that Obamacare will incur \$1.68 trillion of new expenditures in its first decade.

"To say nothing of the price of the uncertainty introduced by an impossibly complex remaking of one-sixth of the economy -- discouraging hiring and expansion as trillions of investable private-sector dollars remain sidelined. The third part of Obama's promised transformation was energy. His cap-and-trade federal takeover was rejected by his own Democratic Senate. So the war on fossil fuels has been conducted unilaterally by bureaucratic fiat.

"Regulations that will kill coal. A no-brainer pipeline (Keystone) rejected lest Canadian oil sands be burned. (China will burn them instead.) A drilling moratorium in the Gulf of Mexico that a federal judge severely criticized as illegal. That was the program -- now so unpopular that Obama barely mentions it. Obamacare got exactly two lines in this year's State of the Union address. Seen any ads touting the stimulus? The drilling moratorium? Keystone?"

That's exactly right. Take a look at that Obama's "Romney Killed My Wife" ad. If Obama was proud of Obamacare, that would have been what they said in that ad, not "Romney killed my wife!" They would have said, "Obamacare would have saved her life," if he was proud of it. But he can't say Obamacare! He doesn't want to mention Obamacare, because it's unpopular. He doesn't campaign on the Keystone pipeline. He doesn't campaign on anything he's done.

He's a sitting duck, ideologically.

He's a sitting duck.

He's a landslide defeat waiting to happen, if we would just unify and go at him ideologically. Now, Krauthammer points out here that the Romney campaign decided they're going to go after, "He's a lousy president. He's a lousy steward." And Snerdley may have a point on that because it's Romney who said, "I'm not going to call him a socialist. I'm going to call him a nice guy who doesn't know what he's doing."

Well, he's not a nice guy, A; and, B, he knows exactly what he's doing. He's an ideologue. He's a liberal Marxist. He knows exactly what he's doing. None of this is incompetent. None of it is an accident. It's all on purpose, if you understand liberalism. Ah! This is a "Hosanna!" moment. I, El Rushbo, no longer feel stranded on an island. Now what's going to happen is blogs will pick this up, Krauthammer's thing, and it will spread. And maybe it will get linkage, traction, whatever, and take off.

I don't care.

I just think it's great that somebody has put two and two together here. But it's still going to boil down to: "Will Romney do it? Will Romney give up this notion, 'Eh, he's not really a bad guy. He's a nice guy; he just doesn't understand. He's incompetent. He's not a socialist'"? I remember telling you back two summers ago, various potential Republican presidential candidates came knocking on the door. It was a kiss-the-ring kind of thing, and this is before most had announced.

It was before it really got ginned up, and I'm not going to mention any names because it won't matter. Virtually every one of them that I spoke to said, "We gotta go after Obama's policies, Rush! We can't go after him. We have to go after his policies," and that's what Romney is doing. We're going after his policies (as Krauthammer says, his "stewardship"), because -- you're, right, Snerdley -- they were afraid (and still are) to go after Obama as what he really is.

They're afraid to make the allegation, and every day the Democrats get up and thank whoever is their god that we leave it alone. I guarantee you they do, because that's the one thing they're scared to death of. And I think it may explain why they're upset at Romney's welfare ad, because it combines going after "stewardship" and also illustrates Obama's ideology. Because it's liberals who don't like the work component in welfare.

RUSH: I have been begging Romney to do this. I have been begging Romney to do this since he became the front-runner in the primaries. When I applauded Newt during the primaries, during the debates, it is because he went ideological. You remember one of the biggest events...? I think it was the South Carolina primary debate. Newt got one of the biggest standing Os, and the first one was when he explained the conservative view about work and how we don't want anybody denied a job.

We want people to be able to go to schools to actually learn things, to be able to read the diploma, and come out and own the business. Remember how the place stood up? He got a couple of other standing Os afterwards. He went ideological. He talked about ideas. This is the foundation. When you learned about all this in junior high, Government 101 or Civics 101, whatever they called it, they covered this. The way it was taught to me, anyway -- and it was naive, admittedly.

But it was the people with the best ideas who won elections. It had nothing to do with who ran the dirtiest campaign or had the most money or any of that. This is the idealistic stage when you're being taught this stuff. But it still works. Ideas matter, ideas triumph, particularly when you believe them and can explain them. That's when you become persuasive. I told Byron York... This did not make his cut, by the way, in the piece at the Washington Examiner.

I said, "All Romney has to do is to get some real conservatives as his spokespeople and this problem won't happen anymore." We don't need the Etch A Sketch guy and we don't need people who are not ideological. I've even used the word. I have begged Romney and the Republican Party at large: "Would you please say this is ideological? Would you please start thinking in terms of ideology?" Say "Democrats are liberals," and that alone tells everybody all they need to

know about what somebody in politics plans to do.


